BIBLIOGRAPHY VS. NOTES

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

The **Bibliography** is an alphabetized list of sources you used, found at the end of your paper. Add a **footnote** or **endnote** citation for every quote, paraphrase, or fact in your paper. Every paper **MUST** include both footnote/endnote citations and a Bibliography page.

WHAT TYPE OF SOURCE AM I USING?

Print Book

Author's Last Name , Author's First Name . Title (in italics) .
Place : Publisher , Year .

E-Book

Author's Last Name , Author's First Name . Title (in italics) .
Place : Publisher , Year . DOI or URL or Provider type (i.e., Kindle) .

Journal Article (accessed online)

Author's Last Name , Author's First Name . " Title of article " .
Name of Journal (in italics) Volume Issue (Year) : Page range . DOI or URL .

YouTube Video

Author's Last Name , Author's First Name . " Title of Video " .
Publishing Organization . Month Day , Year . Video . URL .

Website

* Author's Last Name , Author's First Name . " Page Title " .
Website Title . Last Modified Date . DOI or URL .

* For sources without authors, begin the reference citation with the source's title.
Footnotes/endnotes should have a shortened version of the website title.

FOOTNOTE/ENDNOTE CITATION

The importance of the elephants was made clear when the author wrote, "I cannot visualize my life without them." ¹

SUBSEQUENT FOOTNOTE/ENDNOTE

Used when you're referencing the same author a second or third time.

Daniels' literature review references the connection people have with the book, stating that it "encourages us by identifying with him [Atticus] so strongly...of our own generosity of spirit and our self-regard." ⁵ Additionally, he states, "We wanted to invest our lives in fairytale drama." ⁶
