WORKS CITED VS. IN-TEXT WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

The **Works Cited** is an alphabetized list of sources you used, found at the end of your paper. An **in-text citation** is placed in parentheses after every quote, paraphrase, or fact in your paper. Every paper **MUST** include both in-text citations and a Works Cited page.

Print Book

E-Book

Author's Last Name , Author's First Name . Title (in italics) . Publisher ,
Year Published , Page Range . Title of Website (in italics) , URL (no http://) .

Journal Article (accessed online)

Author's Last Name , Author's First Name . " Title of Article ."
Title of Journal (in italics) , Vol. # , Issue # , Date Published , Page Range .
Title of Website (in italics) , doi: or Stable URL .

YouTube Video

Author's Last Name , First Name . " Title of Video . " YouTube (in italics) ,
uploaded by Name of Channel , Day Month Year . URL

Website

* Author's Last Name , Author's First Name . " Title of Page . "
Title of Site (in italics) , Publisher , Date Published , Stable URL .

* For sources without an author, begin the reference citation with the source's title.
In-text citations should have a shortened version of the website title.

IN-TEXT CITATION USED IN THE BODY OF YOUR ESSAY

AUTHOR'S NAME IN CITATION

The importance of the elephants was made clear when the author wrote, "I cannot visualize my life without them" (Anthony 2).

AUTHOR'S NAME IN TEXT

In Anthony Daniels' literature review, "Harper Lee's Loving-Kindness," he writes about the connection people have with the books, stating that it "encourages us by identifying with him [Atticus] so strongly to bathe in the pleasantly warm waters of our own generosity of spirit and our self-regard" (20).

WEBSITE WITH NO AUTHOR OR PAGE NUMBER

An online newsletter notes, "If you've grown up in a world that requires you to connect concepts, you naturally view the circles holistically, in relation to one another" ("Why Generalists").

AUTHOR'S NAME AND PLAYBACK TIMESTAMP

In her talk at TedXHouston, at 18:56 Brené Brown said, "We just need you to be authentic and real."
